SUPPLIES

- > **Gauze - 1" and 2" rolls**
(for wrapping wounds or using as a temporary muzzle)
- > **Non-stick bandages (2x2, 3x3) and towels or clean strips of cloth**
(for binding wounds)
- > **Adhesive bandage tape - 1"**
(for securing gauze/bandages—do not use band-aids, pets can ingest them!)
- > **Milk of Magnesia and/or activated charcoal**
(for absorbing poison - It is critical to always contact your veterinarian or the animal poison control hotline before inducing vomiting or treating for poison on your own. Many poisons can do additional damage when vomited!)
- > **Hydrogen Peroxide (3%)**
(to induce vomiting - It is critical to always contact your veterinarian or the animal poison control hotline before inducing vomiting or treating for poison on your own. Many poisons can do additional damage when vomited!)
- > **Generic Benadryl (Diphenhydramine) tablets/capsules – 25mg**
(for allergic reactions – correct dosage must be determined by your vet)
- > **Eye dropper or a large syringe without a needle**
(for flushing wounds or giving oral treatments)
- > **Eye wash solution**
- > **Muzzle or muzzle material**
(Many pets will bite when in pain – a long sock, gauze, necktie, or nylon stocking may also be used.)
- > **A digital thermometer and a small jar of petroleum jelly**
(to be used rectally)
